FROM THE TOWN CHAIRMAN

On Wednesday February 13th from 9-12 the Economic Development Session will be held at the Town Hall. Naletta Burr from the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation will moderate the session. Liberty Grove has entered a Memorandum of Understanding with the Door County Economic Development Corporation as part of a plan to improve the economic conditions in the Town. The retention/attraction of younger families, supporting local businesses and improving the overall health of our community is one goal that is being addressed in the MOU. The event on the 13th will be to learn the economic wishes of town residents and collaborate strategies and resources for community development, ideas for enhancement and strategies to accomplish projects. While the initial session will have a little more focus on the Ellison Bay area all Town residents are encourage to participate as this is a Town wide initiative and will include additional sessions in the future. Task Force 2030 was created after the 2018 Annual Spring Meeting to address what the Town should look and feel like in the year 2030. One goal is to retain our rural character and natural beauty. Please plan to attend and inform your neighbors about the event. We are focusing on planning and controlling the future of Liberty Grove.

Please contact anyone you know, who may have an interest as well as insight as to how the Town of Liberty Grove can grow economically, while maintaining the character we have all moved here for and would like to see maintained.

Questions about sand/salt mix

We have been getting inquiries as to why there is no sand/salt mix on our back loading dock this year. Our tax dollars pay for the sand/salt mix for our roads. We have in the past, as a courtesy, offered 5 gal. pails for \$3.00 which residents had to provide and fill themselves from our loading dock. Last year we noticed on many occasions that the entire loading dock would be empty and there was no money in the collection box.
