FROM YOUR TOWN CHAIRMAN

"Our rural roads are twice as deadly as other roads in the state, and more deadly than the national average--and estimates suggest that roadway features are a factor in about 1/3 of fatal crashes." This quote appears in the May issue of the Wisconsin Towns Association monthly publication. We are very fortunate in Liberty Grove to have a well maintained, safe roadway system that has been able to catch up and keep pace with needed maintenance. Several years ago, the Finance Committee created a budget that addressed the much-needed funding to catch up on road maintenance. It resulted in a request for a levy cap override which was passed by the town electors who understood and wanted well maintained and safe roads as an important part of the town infrastructure and were willing to cover the expense to achieve that goal. Roads are one key to a healthy, safe community with improving economic wellbeing as they serve as arteries within the community.

Another infrastructure item that has become very important to our town economy, wellbeing and safety is access to broadband internet. It is well documented locally, regionally and nationally that access to broadband internet is a vital asset to a community's health and future. In reality, it is no longer a luxury but a necessity to life in the 21st Century. Our Tech Committee has addressed this issue and searched for answers on how to provide adequate service to the large expanse of underserved Liberty Grove area. At this time only one provider has indicated a willingness to make that investment and has been assisted from the town government. Liberty Grove was a partner in a grant received last year that provided for the construction of additional towers and equipment upgrades on some existing towers. One taller tower was installed at the town gravel pit several years ago. Five underserved areas have been identified in the Town. Due to our geography and lack of population concentration wireless access, barring any new technology, currently is the answer to obtain the required up and download of data required to go beyond personal uses such as email and searching the web, whether we like it or not, is the use of towers. Much like the cell phone towers, high voltage electrical structures and even telephone poles that dot our landscape they become a reality and necessary part of our everyday life. A research study by University of Wisconsin Whitewater concluded that access to high speed internet in Liberty Grove would have a large economic impact on our community. Recent developments are also indicating that a lot of important medical contact in the future will depend on adequate internet access. It has been a goal to retain and attract younger families and residents to our area as our population ages. One of the key ingredients to that today is the availability of broad band access. Many issues and challenges will continue to be addressed by the board, administration and our committees to find best solutions that benefit the entire Town. If we remain technology deprived in this area that goal will not be attained. What most visitors and second or third home owners consider a given is simply not available in large portions of Liberty Grove. While our desire is to remain rural in character with a respect for our environment, ecology and citizens it should not prevent us from being a part of the 21st Century.

May 7th marked the first-year anniversary of the NWTC Learning and Innovation Center located in the former Bay Lake Bank building in Sister Bay. Liberty Grove played an important role in NWTC's decision to open the campus in northern Door. I want to thank Supervisor Nancy Goss, David and Karen Studebaker, Mary Pat Carlson, Administrator Kalms and Clerk/Treasurer Johnson for their work on the project. Also, to the NWTC administrative staff for the well-planned center. If you have not had the opportunity to visit the campus, please do so as it is a wonderful addition servicing all of northern Door County.

Annual Town meeting – The Annual meeting was held on April 16th at 7:00pm. John Lowry was sworn in as Chairman and Cathy Ward and Nancy Goss as Supervisors. Anastasia Bell was sworn in as Clerk/Treasurer and Douglas Curzon as Deputy Clerk/Treasurer. At the Board meeting April 17th, the Town has hired Door County Inspections LLC to replace Safebuilt.
