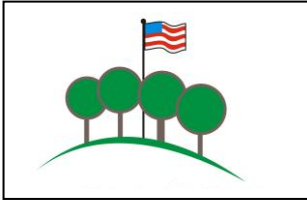

### ***From the Town Chairman***

Town committees are beginning to again meet, via teleconferencing, after several months due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The Finance committee held an informational meeting presented by Administrator Kalms and Clerk/Treasurer Bell. The purpose of the meeting was to familiarize new members, plus committee chairs as to how the budget is prepared and the role of the Finance committee. The ad hoc Mariners Park committee toured the site recently as they begin formulating plans for the proposed park. Public access to teleconferencing meetings is available on the Town website which provides information on how to enter the meeting.

The Town Hall and Office physically remains closed to the public. Questions can be directed to the office by email or telephone. No decision has been made as to when the office and hall will be open as normal.

The Board has decided to extend the Health Emergency to the end of June. That decision will be revisited at the next Board meeting. Provisions for financial assistance from FEMA require the emergency declaration to be in place when applying for the funds.

The Board has passed Resolution 5-20 regarding Penalties for Late Property Tax payments. Information on that resolution may be obtained by contacting the Town Office or the Town Website.

The Board will continue it's discussion of how and when to open Town Parks. Much of the discussion has focused on whether to open restroom facilities or provide Porta Potties instead, as a way to mitigate the spread of Covid-19. Sanitation is a big problem and how to keep the Town Crew safe from exposure.

Scott Construction of Delafield has been awarded the chip sealing contract for 2020. Northeast Asphalt has completed the paving projects for this year.

### Fireworks

When shooting fireworks over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday please be aware that a permit is required through the Town office. It does require the signature of the Town Chairman and the Fire Chief.

It will require proof of liability insurance. That can be faxed to our office at 920-854-7366.

### From the Army Corps of Engineers

Lake Superior’s June 5<sup>th</sup> forecasted level is 6 inches lower than it was a year ago, while the June 5<sup>th</sup> forecasted levels for Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, and Erie are 7, 2, and 1 inches, respectively higher than last year’s level. Lake Ontario’s predicted level for June 5<sup>th</sup> is 23 inches below what it was at this time last year. The projected June 5<sup>th</sup> level for Lake Michigan-Huron is 5 inches above its highest monthly average level for June. A month from now, Lakes Superior is predicted to be 2 inches higher than its June 5<sup>th</sup> projected level, while Lake Michigan-Huron and Lake St. Clair are predicted to be an inch higher, and Lakes Erie and Ontario are expected to be 1 and 2 inches, respectively below their June 5<sup>th</sup> expected level. # MASKING GUIDANCE

## CLOTH FACE MASKS



- ▶ ALSO KNOWN AS: Face coverings
- ▶ PURPOSE: Protects others by preventing the release of droplets from wearer's nose and mouth
- ▶ INTENDED USER: Everyone in public settings to prevent spread
- ▶ REUSE: Wash daily, or if mask is soiled

## SURGICAL FACE MASKS



- ▶ ALSO KNOWN AS: paper, simple, or disposable mask
- ▶ PURPOSE: Protects others by preventing the release of droplets from wearer's nose and mouth
- ▶ INTENDED USER: Medical and emergency personnel due to large amount of exposure in high risk setting
- ▶ REUSE: Should be discarded daily, or if mask is soiled

## N95 FACE MASKS



N95 without filter  
PURPOSE: Provides protection to wearer by filtering air as it enters and exits the mask



N95 with Filter  
PURPOSE: Provides protection to wearer by filtering air as it enters the mask



KN95  
PURPOSE: Protection similar to surgical face mask

- ▶ INTENDED USER: Medical and emergency personnel due to large amount of exposure in high risk setting, fit testing required to obtain the correct mask size

## HOW LONG DO CORONAVIRUSES\* LIVE ON SURFACES?

SURFACE	EXAMPLES	DAYS OR HOURS
Metal	Doorknobs, Jewelry, Silverware	5 Days
Glass	Drinking glasses, Mirrors, Windows	UP TO 5 Days
Ceramics	Dishes, Pottery, Mugs	5 Days
Paper	Newspaper, Magazines	UP TO 5 Days
Wood	Furniture, Decking	4 Days
Plastics	Milk bottles, Bus seats, Elevator buttons	2-3 Days
Stainless Steel	Refrigerators, Pots/pans, Sinks, Water bottles	2-3 Days
Cardboard	Shipping boxes	1 Day
Aluminum	Soda cans, Tinfoil, Water bottles	2-8 Hours
Copper	Pennies, Teakettles, Cookware	4 Hours
Food/Water	Doesn't seem to spread through food, and has not been found in water.	

**WHAT YOU CAN DO:** Disinfect all surfaces and objects in your home daily with a household cleaning spray or wipe. Wash hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and warm water, especially after visiting the supermarket or bringing in packages.
