

From the Town Chairman

The Board is considering how best to proceed with an option for citizens to contribute to a specific town project. This follows an earlier consideration of forming a 501c3 foundation to accept and distribute donations for projects within the Town. The building at the Ellison Bay Town Beach is one example along with the Town property in Gills Rock. In both cases a specific plan/design must be in place with additional safeguards to make sure the funds are used correctly. The Board has discussed the Woman's Club building in Ellison Bay in the past but has not requested a specific project or design. Currently an ad hoc committee is studying the Gills Rock property for a Town Park. When a final decision is reached it will be presented to the Board from the Parks and Property Committee. The idea of special funding for projects would help in paying for them. Many options are under discussion at this time.

There were many reports of fireworks in the Town over the 4th weekend. Very few permits were issued and it is important to remember with the permitting process neighbors are alerted in the event they have pets or persons within their household that are negatively affected and have time to take the appropriate action to prepare for the fireworks.

As we see increases in the number of covid-19 cases in Door County it is imperative to follow the CDC recommendations to wear masks and social distancing whenever possible. Masks are important for they protect those around you as well as yourself. Current Indications are that the covid-19 pandemic will be with us for some time.

The Town Office remains closed to walk-in traffic as a protection for staff. Town business can be conducted by phone or email. Meetings continue to be held using the Zoom platform. The meetings are open to the public with access posted on agendas.

From the Army Corps of Engineers

Lake Superior’s July 3rd forecasted level is 5 inches below its level of a year ago, while the July 3rd forecasted level for Lake Michigan-Huron is 4 inches higher than last year’s level. The projected levels of Lakes St. Clair and Erie for July 3rd are 1 and 4 inches below what they were a year ago. Lake Ontario’s July 3rd predicted level is 26 inches below its level of a year ago. The projected July 3rd level for Lake Michigan-Huron is 3 inches above its record-high monthly mean level for July, while Lake St. Clair’s projected level matches its July record-high. A month from now, Lake Superior is predicted to be an inch higher than its July 3rd projected level, while by August 3rd, levels for Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, Erie, and Ontario are predicted to be below their July 3rd expected levels by 1, 3, 3, and 4 inches, respectively.
