

From the Town Chairman

The Board has extended the Emergency Health Declaration until December 31,2020. Based upon the increasing numbers of Covid-19 in the County it was felt best to keep the declaration active in the event any action it allows will be available without another meeting or declaration. If conditions improve prior to that date we can always end the declaration.

Protective rip rap will be placed along the shore of the proposed Mariners Park in Gills Rock and Wills Park in Ellison Bay. High water is making this a necessity to protect the properties. Protection has also been placed on North Bay Drive where erosion is threatening the road.

The administration has been asked to investigate a possible facilities evaluation. The rolling Five year plans have proven beneficial in anticipating future needs and estimated costs. Our Administrator, town crew and committees are very good at noticing situations and items that need immediate attention. A facilities evaluation by an outside source could provide an oversight and suggestions of long range needs and improvements/replacements to the various facilities the Town owns and operates.

The Board issues operator licenses for persons wishing to work in establishments that dispense alcoholic beverages and special events. This is done as a protection to make sure no possible background issues could influence a person's performance or decisions in the anticipated position. Background checks are done on each applicant and presented to the Board. In cases where there is a question the Board has set a protocol to interview the applicant in a closed session.

The Wisconsin Town Association will be holding their Annual via a recorded online presentation by telephone or web access. It is another event affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. All board and committee meetings continue to be conducted utilizing the Zoom conferencing app. In all likelihood this will continue until positive signs are recorded that covid-19 threat is lessening. All those meetings are available to the public utilizing the teleconferencing. Access information is available for each meeting when it is posted.

Administrator report – Kalms reported that the next status conference for the WWTP will be 8/7/2020. Paving, shouldering, and oiling have been completed and crushing is in progress.

Operator licenses – Bell provided a list of 8 renewals and 3 new operators. **Ward moved, Goss second** to approve the new and renewal operator licenses as presented. Passed 5-0.

From the Army Corps of Engineers, Lake Levels

The July 31st projected levels remain well above chart datum. With the exception of Lake Michigan-Huron, levels are lower than their levels from July 31st 2019. Lakes Superior, St. Clair, Erie, and Ontario are 3, 2, 4 and 22 inches lower than July 31st 2019. On the contrary, Lake Michigan-Huron is 3 inches above its 2019 level. Over the past month, levels for lakes Superior and Michigan-Huron have rose or stayed the same, whereas St. Clair, Erie and Ontario levels dropped 2, 3 and 3 inches, respectively. In one month, levels are forecasted to decrease, with the exception of Lake Superior which is forecasted to be at the same level it is now. Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, Erie and Ontario are forecasted to see levels fall between 2 to 4 inches over the next month. Michigan-Huron is projected to drop 2 inches; St. Clair will drop 3 inches; Erie will drop 4 inches, and Ontario will drop 4 inches.
